



Request for Applications (RFA) Navigator

Virginia's Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) includes 15 sub-initiatives to strengthen our rural health care safety net. Virginia's Department of Medical Assistance Services has contracted with key implementation partners (KIP) to distribute funds for each sub-initiative. This resource is designed to help RHTP applicants navigate the application process. For final information on program requirements, timelines and funding eligibility please refer directly to the RFAs.

> Can my organization apply to more than one RFA?

Yes! RFAs are based on sub-initiatives and organizations can apply to participate in the sub-initiatives that align with their work. If an organization would like to apply to multiple RFAs, note that organizations must submit an application for each RFA.

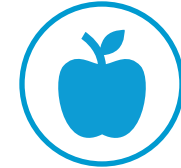
> How can I prepare to apply?

Organizations interested in RHTP funding are subject to federal rules.

1. Your organization **MUST** have **active SAM.gov registration** and valid **Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)**, associated with accurate organization details.
 - **To register:** Go to [SAM.gov Entity Registration](#). Processing of your registration can take several weeks.
 - **Active exclusions in SAM.gov:** Any organizations that have debarment or suspension flags in SAM.gov may be prohibited from receiving federal funds under this program.
2. Your organization will be required to submit additional information to determine your eligibility for federal funds. This includes:
 - **Financial management system:** Your organization must have a financial management system that can track federal grant funds separately from other program funds.
 - **Financial documentation:** You must provide information on your federal single audit or your organization's audited financial statements from the past three years.
 - **Audit findings:** You must be prepared to provide information on any outstanding audit findings issued in the past three years.
 - **Compliance history:** Your organization will need to share information about any past noncompliance with state or federal requirements.
 - **Legal history:** You should be prepared to provide details on any litigation or investigations involving your organization or leadership within the last 5 years.
 - **Federal program experience:** You will need to share your organization's prior experience managing federally funded programs.
 - **Disallowed costs:** Your organization will need to identify any prior disallowed costs or funds that were required to be returned to federal agencies.

> What may exclude applicants from being chosen?

- **Incomplete or inaccurate applications:** Applications that are incomplete, submitted after the deadline, contain materially inaccurate information, or do not include required documentation may not be considered.
- **RFA requirements:** Applicants must meet the eligibility, rural service area, project scope, and documentation requirements in the applicable RFA.
- **Federal exclusions:** Applicants suspended, debarred, or otherwise excluded from receiving federal funds may be ineligible.
- **Program alignment:** Proposed activities and costs must align with the RFA, Virginia's approved RHTP initiative, and applicable funding requirements.
- **Organizational capacity:** Applicants must be able to manage, track, document, and report federal funds. Compliance or financial management concerns may affect selection or result in additional award conditions.
- **Conflicts of interest:** Applicants must disclose actual, apparent, or potential conflicts. Individuals with a conflict may not participate in reviewing or approving the affected application.

Additional Considerations

- **State agency applicants:** State agencies may apply when permitted by the RFA. If the applicant is part of the agency overseeing the funding opportunity, the relationship must be disclosed and an independent review process must be used.
- **Other funding:** Receiving other federal, state, local, or private funding does not automatically make an applicant ineligible. However, RHTP funds may not duplicate or replace existing funding, pay the same cost twice, or satisfy another award's matching requirement. Applicants must disclose related funding and distinguish the activities and costs supported by RHTP.

> RHTP Program-Level Spending Caps

Additional program-level limitations apply to Virginia's total RHTP award for each budget period, including a 10% cap on administrative expenses, a 15% cap on provider payments, a 20% cap on capital expenditures and infrastructure, a cap of the lesser of 10% or \$20 million for Rural Tech Catalyst Fund activities, and a 5% cap on replacing an EMR system when a HITECH-certified system was already in place as of September 1, 2025.

Category	Description
Administrative Expenses	Virginia may use no more than 10% of the amount allotted for a budget period for administrative expenses. The cap includes both direct and indirect administrative costs.
Provider Payments	Funding classified as provider payments under Use of Funds Category B may not exceed 15% of Virginia's total CMS award for the applicable budget period. Provider payments also cannot duplicate billable services or modify existing fee schedule payments.
Capital Expenditures and Infrastructure	Funding under Use of Funds Category J may not exceed 20% of Virginia's total CMS award for the applicable budget period. New construction remains unallowable, although certain renovations, alterations, infrastructure investments, and equipment upgrades may be permitted when linked to approved program goals.
Rural Tech Catalyst Fund	Funding for initiatives similar to the Rural Tech Catalyst Fund may not exceed the lesser of: ▪ 10% of Virginia's award for the applicable budget period, or ▪ \$20 million for that budget period.
Certain EMR Replacement Costs	No more than 5% of Virginia's total CMS award for the applicable budget period may support replacement of an EMR system when a HITECH-certified EMR system was already in place as of September 1, 2025.

> Use of Fund Examples

Use of funds varies based on the initiative you are applying for. CMS also provides guidance on how funds can be used. Below are examples of what is and is not allowable but does not represent an exhaustive list. Please refer to CMS FAQ for additional details. If you still have questions after reading, please refer to the specific contact for the initiative to which you are applying.

Allowable Costs

Allowable costs may include, but are not limited to, the following categories when directly related to the approved RHTP initiative(s):

- **Program administration and implementation:** Personnel, fringe benefits, and operating expenses necessary to carry out approved RHTP activities, provided administrative costs remain within applicable CMS or DMAS limits.
- **Planning, coordination, and capacity building:** Activities that support the planning, coordination, and development of capacity needed for rural health system transformation.
- **Training and technical assistance:** Workforce development, provider support, and implementation assistance aligned with RHTP objectives.
- **Technology and infrastructure:** Health information technology, data systems, cybersecurity, telehealth, and other digital tools permitted under CMS guidance.
- **Authorized provider payments:** Payments for delivering health care items or services when expressly authorized under CMS RHTP guidance and within applicable limitations.
- **Evaluation and performance measurement:** Evaluation, data collection, and performance measurement activities required to demonstrate program progress and outcomes.

Unallowable Costs

- **Pre-award or out-of-period costs:** Expenses incurred before the award begins or outside the approved period of performance.
- **Construction and unapproved capital improvements:** Construction is prohibited. Capital improvements that materially increase the value or useful life of land, buildings, or equipment require prior written approval.
- **Costs outside the approved project:** Goods or services that are not allocable to the approved scope of work or budget.
- **Matching or replacement funding:** Costs used to meet another funding source's matching requirements or replace existing state, local, tribal, or private funding, including existing staff salaries.
- **Another party's legal responsibilities:** Services, equipment, workplace modifications, or other supports that an employer or another entity is legally required to provide.
- **Profit or unrelated research:** Profit paid to a subrecipient or independent research and development that is not directly tied to approved program implementation.
- **Lobbying and advocacy:** Activities intended to influence legislation, regulations, appropriations, or administrative actions.
- **Unapproved meals and promotional expenses:** Unapproved meals or entertainment, promotional items, gifts, souvenirs, or advertising intended solely to promote the organization.
- **Prohibited technology:** Covered telecommunications or video surveillance equipment prohibited under federal requirements.
- **Unsupported costs:** Expenses that lack adequate invoices, receipts, payroll records, or other required supporting documentation.
